FITZROY RIVER SUPPLY SCHEMES

EDEN BANN WEIR

Located in the Fitzroy Basin in Central Queensland.

The boundaries of the three supplemented water supply schemes cover a 250km section of the Fitzroy River, stretching from the confluence of the Mackenzie and Dawson Rivers all the way to the Fitzroy Barrage west of Rockhampton.

Rookwood and Eden Bann supply schemes are operated by SunWater, a Queensland Government-owned corporation.

The Fitzroy Barrage Water Supply Scheme is operated by Fitzroy River Water, a commercial business unit of Rockhampton Regional Council.


