- Mount Hay is the remains of an extinct ancient volcano, which was last active about 120 million years ago
- Mount Hay thundereggs are a result of gas pockets forming in molten rhyolite lava
- Koorana Crocodile Farm opened in 1981 and was the first commercial crocodile farm in Oueensland
- The Capricorn Caves were first discovered in 1881 by Norwegian migrant John Olsen
- The Capricorn Caves are one of the largest privately owned cave systems in Australia most are lease holds
